Action Item	Action	Outcome
1.	AQC to clarify its position on the questions raised by Friends of the Upper Hunter following the public meeting in Aberdeen	Comment was sought, however the company elected to not respond given the clear public opposition from the group.
2.	AQC to follow up with leaseholders over stocking rates on ex-Macintyre property	Currently stocked with 30 cows & calves, 150 heifers. Previously stocks were greater, but have been reduced due to the drought. Management plan for the property is rotational grazing.

### AQC Strategic Partnership

- On 2 July 2019, the Company announced that certain conditions under the Share Sale Agreement (SSA) with SNR were not satisfied by SNR by 1 July 2019 (the cut-off date for satisfaction of those conditions) and the SSA was terminated by AQC effective on 4 July 2019.
- The Company has recently been in discussions with other potential development partners in relation to their interest in recommencing underground mining at Dartbrook. AQC is considering a range of options to optimise returns for all shareholders, including continued dialogue with SNR.

### 2. Underground Modification (MOD7)

- MOD7 was determined on 9 August by the IPC.
- The IPC determination:
  - Approved mining of the Kayuga Seam using bord and pillar methods:
  - Approved use of the varied coal clearance system; and
  - Refused the proposed five year extension to the duration of the Dartbrook development consent.






2019 rainfall: 292.2 mm to end of July Dartbrook average yearly rainfall 1995-2017= 586 mm






PM10 (Particulate Matter <10μm) NEPC guideline limit is 50ug/m<sup>3</sup>






Insoluble Matter is Ash + Combustible Matter
Ash is more representative of dust component, remainder is typically organic matter (e.g. insects)
















### **Environmental Monitoring continued**



- Riparian & Stream Health Monitoring
  - Baseline monitoring program in October 2018 and May 2019 at twelve locations, looking at:
    - Habitat quality
    - Water quality
    - Macroinvertebrate species diversity
  - Data was not able to be gathered at all upstream sites due to dry conditions. Sites to be monitored in future events to establish baseline.
  - Overall, the surveys confirmed that the sites assessed were in a moderate to highly disturbed state. This was primarily due to impacts from landuse resulting in erosion and the presence of exotic vegetation.

- Ongoing land management and monitoring, including:
  - Reshaping sections of containment drains at the East and West Site
  - Tree trimming and slashing in powerline corridors to reduce bushfire and safety risks
